- 1) What are the legal implications of a survey for which you receive payment?
 - 2) Having agreed the factual items concerning a survey e.g. address, size and type of property, previous works, guarantees etc, list other items which should be agreed with your client prior to the survey being carried out.
 - 3) Where a client asks you to look only at specific areas of a property but outside of these areas you observe signs of penetrating damp, what action would you take?
 - 4) When carrying out a pre-purchase survey of a property for a client, you fail to detect a serious defect. What are the legal implications including the basis used to calculate any amount of damages that could be awarded?
 - 5) Explain the difference between a 'risk' and a 'hazard', as defined by the Health and Safety Executive, and give a simple example to illustrate that you understand the difference.

- 6) When undertaking a survey of a building with public access, describe the actions that you would take on noticing severe decay in the ends of several floor joists.
- 7) What extra safety precautions might be necessary when carrying out a survey on a large unoccupied building.
- 8) List all the potential hazards involved in drilling holes in walls.
- 9) For each of the hazards listed in your answer to question 8), indicate how you can minimise the risks to operatives.
- 10) In what ways does the Wildlife and Countryside Act affect remedial treatments?
- 11) In a company with ten employees, list the duties that the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 places on the company as an employer?
- 12) In terraced housing, remedial treatments may include work to party walls.
 - a) Give the name and the date of the piece of legislation which covers such works, and
 - b) Give examples of **both** works to party walls which would be covered by the legislation **and** works to party walls which would not be covered by the legislation.
- 13) Where any form of remedial works are being carried out in an area with little ventilation, what problems may arise?
- 14) Describe the hazard warning label found on products that are irritant.
- 15) List the titles of at least six sources of information, for example Codes of Practice, relating to surveying, reporting and conducting remedial treatment works.
- 16) What safety precautions should be taken during the transportation of products from the company premises to the treatment site?
