## Amenity Standard providing assurance of quality and professional standards

Since its formal launch at the start of this year, the Amenity Standard has been very much welcomed by all sides of the amenity sector and is already being incorporated into tender documents and specifications going forward. It has also received full support from policy makers and key stakeholders. The Amenity Standard, when held and displayed, demonstrates that all operational activities undertaken are at the highest professional standards and fully comply with all regulations and codes of best practice. The objective would be to move to a position where all work undertaken in amenity management conforms to the Standard as a requirement, providing assurance to all involved that the processes seek to create safe, healthy and sustainable areas fit for purpose using fully trained and qualified operatives.

The Standard is being administered by the Amenity Forum and any Amenity Standard organisation must be a member of an approved assurance scheme. At launch, three assurance schemes were recognised but discussions are on-going with all sub sectors of the important, essential, and diverse amenity sector about recognising further schemes or indeed in development of new ones. Currently there are two new assurance schemes in development to cover golf courses and other sports turf and facilities and more following. The approved assurance scheme is audited fully before being recognised by the Amenity Standard.

The Standard has received the backing of all national governments in the UK and is very much aligned to thinking as the UK government seeks to review the National Action Plan relating to weed, pest and disease management in the coming months"

To lead, coordinate and encourage achievement of "Best Practice" objectives in weed, pest & disease management

To ensure that all practices are sustainable and protect the environment with minimised risks to public health.

To run a communication programme to support these aims and to promote the image of the sector among stakeholders and the public.

To coordinate and encourage the establishment of sustainable qualifications, training and CPD activity, specifically for the Amenity sector

To organise activities within the Amenity Forum membership and linked organisations, such that Amenity Forum objectives are developed in a coordinated way
